#### **Our Vision and Values**

Hammer Lane Academy is a setting which seeks to continually develop its students and staff and influence practices and attitudes. At Hammer Lane students and staff work together in a safe and happy environment where there is a culture driven by nurture and passion to prepare children for the future. It is our belief that every child should have the provision in place which allows them to achieve their full potential, we are aspirational and strive for achievement for all.













#### **Our Staff Team**

We take great pride in our staff team and ensure that we are always working to further improve the quality of offer that our children receive. We enable this to happen in the following ways:

- Our support staff are paid a full time week to ensure they are involved in all aspects of planning, preparation and resourcing
- All staff attend all CPD sessions to ensure that everyone receives the same training, key messages and level of quality
- Staff are encouraged to deliver their own CPD sessions using their individual strengths and experiences to build breath of experience alongside staff value
- Across our settings we have a strong network of support that ensures we are always learning from each other. This includes visiting partner settings and sharing good practice.
- We provide opportunities for staff to follow their skills and interests to ensure our development is innovative
- We operate a 1:2 ratio within setting so there is an adult for every 2 children. Thia is a flexible model - staff are not assigned children, they work with everyone in their class.

#### **Our Parents**

Our parents work exceptionally well with us as a school- the partnership between us is key to ensuring that our children are safe, happy and progressing. Many of our children arrive to school via transport and so it is crucial that our parents feel that they are kept well informed and that they feel they can get in touch with us via their preferred method of communication. To boost our parental engagement and parents' knowledge of the school day we use a variety of methods;

- A weekly newsletter with key information, 'shout outs' for the week and information regarding what each class has covered that week.
- Tapestry- this is an online tool that parents can use to access photos and videos of their child and written information about their current assessment levels and next steps.
- Open emails and direct contact with school leaders and class teachers so that any queries are answered on the same day.
- Stay and play events where parents can attend to spend time with their child in the school environment.
- A parental co- production group led by our SENCO to look at any developments and ensure that these happen.
- Regular parents evenings and 'check in' phonecalls led by staff.

#### **Our Governors**

We have a strong Academy Standards Committee (ASC) in place for our Newstead site who have the vital role of providing challenge and support for school. Our Governors meet once per term and also complete monitoring visits during this time to ensure that they are well informed in regard to our offer and current position. We have a wealth of knowledge and experience across our ASC to ensure that we are being appropriately challenged for the best interests of our children. The knowledge and experience includes;

- Headteacher of local mainstream setting with an attached SEN provision.
- Inclusion Manager who has worked for LA services focused on SCI needs and autism.
- SENCO
- Primary Strategy Lead for a local Trust of Specialist settings and schools
- IT manager



To achieve this we use Cornerstones as the basis for our curriculum and then adapt this to ensure our children are receiving the precise offer that they need. Our curriculum is built around the theme of 'ambition without limits' we push our children to achieve their absolute best.

Our curriculum is built around the child- our children are our starting point- where they are now, where we would like them to go next and how they will get there. This means that knowledge of each child must be substantial, accurate and constantly updated to ensure group and individual activities are pitched at the exact level that each child needs. We ensure that we constantly reflect on the learning point of each child and ask ourselves-'What next?' We consider 'How do we know?' We move at the pace that is right for each individual child but ensure that this is done in way that ensures no time is wasted. This can be difficult to achieve which is why we only employ the very best staff, we provide regular high quality CPD and we ensure that our setting as a whole is reflective.

We regularly review our curriculum offer through learning walks and monitoring activities including book looks and talking to our children. We use termly pupil progress meetings to carefully track progress and identify any areas that may require a particular focus to ensure progress is optimised.

Our curriculum and work that children complete is shared daily with our parents and carers through Tapestry which is our online learning tool. Parents can see photographs and videos of their child and staff can use these to track and evidence progress and next steps.

#### So what does this look like?

The learning experiences we offer our children work as whole class, small group and individual learning activities and tasks. Each class has a curriculum approach that is precisely tailored towards the cohort and individual children within the class. For some children this means that many activities are based around sensory experiences and exploratory play in order to learn and develop. Some of our children can engage with small groups tasks and challenges and work cooperatively to complete set activities. Where children ae able to they will access elements of more formal learning. We ensure that every child is challenged and

supported each day, week and term to make progress and small steps towards their targets.

#### Which approaches do we use?

At Hammer Lane Academy we use a range of approaches to meet the needs of our children and to ensure that they are able to access the full curriculum that we offer. We regularly revisit and reflect upon the approaches that are bring used for group and individual sessions to ensure that strategies and provision in place are the most suitable for each child at that point in time. Examples of some of the approaches and strategies that we use are:

- TEACCH
- PECS
- Makaton
- Music interaction
- Attention Autism
- Intensive Interaction
- Lego Therapy
- Sensory circuits
- Tacpac
- ELSA
- Schema

visitors which is a key component to ensure that children are experiencing the breadth of curriculum offer. Each unit within Cornerstones has an experience linked to it- this may be an experience that takes place within the classroom where children design or make something. Alternatively, some of the experiences include visitors to the classroom for example a vet, a doctor or a chef. Other units include visits outside of the classroom and children may go to places such as Yorkshire Wildlife Park, a local farm. We are keen to ensure that our offer is as full and rich as possible and we actively work to ensure that additional elements and components are added-child dependent.

# **Community**

We have links with local providers and are keen to develop further links within the local community.

We want our school to be viewed as a vital element of the Sharlston community and we want our children to be seen as active citizens within this.

Our children deserve the very best learning opportunities and a chance to explore the world and all the wonder contained within it.

Examples of links we have made within our Newstead setting include;

- Links with the community café- with cookery lessons taking place there
- Links with the local gardens and allotments- we support with digging and planting vegetables to grow
- Links with the local Library- with visits to look at and share books together
- Links with a local farm- to experience handling and caring for animals

As we establish ourselves as a brand new setting in Sharlston we will aim to develop links to provide such opportunities for our Hammer Lane family.
